

BOARD OF PUBLIC WORKS AND SAFETY MEETING

October 7, 2002
TIME: 9:00 A.M.

PRESENT: Mayor Gary Bailey, Bob Bostic and Herb Hunter.

Majesty Manor Deed of Dedication will come up for approval or disapproval again next month. The manholes are ok.

Police Chief Bill Meyerrose brought up the subject of purchasing police vehicles. Mr. Meyerrose stated that the former police chief had been approved for 4 vehicles and Mr. Meyerrose ask to be able to purchase a fifth vehicle so as to be able to get back in the three car rotation a year starting next year. Mr. Meyerrose stated that they would be trading in 5 vehicles and would only need approximately \$3300 more to purchase the fifth vehicle.

Motion by Herb Hunter and seconded by Bob Bostic to approve the fifth vehicle and trade-ins. So passed.

Police Chief Meyerrose presented to the Board for approval of Brendan Bridges completing his one-year probationary period as a patrolman and the recommendation of promoting Brendan to the rank of First Class.

Motion by Bob Bostic and seconded by Herb Hunter to approve the promotion of Brendan Bridges. So passed.

Darren Burkhart gave the progress report of the Wastewater Treatment Facility Improvements, Main Street Sewer Replacement – Phase 2 and the North Side Sewer Replacement – Phase 2.

Darren stated that the paving would be done in the spring of 2003 at the Wastewater Treatment Plant.

East Central Avenue will be closed for approximately three days on the phase 2 main street sewer replacement.

On the north side sewer replacement phase 2, they have run into a problem. Currently the existing sewer is located within 20 ft. of one of the City's municipal water wells. IDEM's current regulations do not allow this to occur. HNTB is looking into rerouting the proposed sewer around the existing water well to maximize the distance from the well.

Motion by Herb Hunter and seconded by Bob Bostic to approve sewer adjustments to the water bills of the following: Deborah Coy \$281.77, Delmar & Mary Herbert \$31.39, Betty Dressler \$129.26, Mary Preble \$315.62, Maurice Jones \$17.51, Willa Marie Barnes \$16.23, and Joe Lecher \$25.75. So passed.

Jeff Smith Wastewater Superintendent presented the Board with a handout on the costs for land disposal of biosolids being: 1. Top Notch BioSolids 0.03 cent per gallon 2. Merrell Brothers 0.0894 cent per gallon.

Greensburg Wastewater Treatment Plant cost is 0.025 and the City wants to continue applying the BioSolids themselves from May to September. The City would like to contract with Andy Reiger of Top Notch BioSolids for the Spring and Fall applications. Jeff stated that this would help out a lot with the time frame in which the biosolids need to be land applied.

Motion by Bob Bostic and seconded by Herb Hunter to approve contracting with Top Notch BioSolids for the Spring and Fall pending review by City Attorney Frank I. Hamilton. So passed.
