

BOARD OF WORKS MEETING  
FEBRUARY 2, 2007  
TIME: 8:00 A.M.

PRESENT: Mayor Frank Manus, Mike Riley and Glenn Tebbe.

Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Minutes were approved.

Wastewater Superintendent Jeff Smith gave a review of the Post Construction Storm Water Runoff that he will be bringing before the Council in the form of an Ordinance. This is to comply with the Indiana Department of Environmental Management Rule 13. It is a Stormwater Design and Construction Manual for the City of Greensburg and would apply to areas of over one acre.

Police Chief Bill Meyerrose told the Board that Homeland Security is mandating the Greensburg Police and Fire go to an 800 MHZ radios. A grant from the Federal and State of \$100,098 has been awarded towards the changing of the radios to the 800 MHZ.

The amount needed for the changeover of the dispatcher's equipment at the police department is \$38,120. This is just an update and so far has not cost the City any monies. The police department will be switching over around March 1<sup>st</sup>. Bill told the Board that the Sheriff department is already using the 800 MHZ radios and in order for the two departments to communicate the police department needs to change their system.

Fire Chief Scott Chasteen had a letter from firefighter Steve Ramer requesting to retire and has never taken a sick day in his 28 years of service. The policy requests a 90 day notice in order to be paid for the amount of sick days accumulated. Because of employment circumstances Steve can only give a notice of 60 days and is requesting an exception by the Board.

Glenn Tebbe complimented Steve Ramer on his dedication of employment to the City and would like to take this under advisement before making a decision.

Mike Riley complimented Steve Ramer on his many years of service to the City and to the Fire Department.

Mayor Manus stated that the City certainly appreciated Steve's dedication to the City and to the Fire Department and wished him the best in his new endeavors.

**The Board will take this request under advisement.**

Scott Chasteen Fire Chief told the Board that their department was successful on a Federal Grant through Representative Mike Pence. The grant is for \$47,900 with a local

match of \$3000 - \$4000. These monies are for the exhaust system needed in the truck area.

Darren Burkhart of HNTB gave an update. The Wastewater plant survey is done and the review will be available soon. They are finalizing all permits.

On the water side, the raw water survey will be completed soon.

A pre-construction meeting was held on the elevated tank and the plans to start turning dirt are for the last of February and the schedule is to have the tank operable by the end of October.

Honda is planning on having their own credit union and that will be put in the vicinity of the elevated tank.

It has been learned that Mr. Gene Hood that owns Majesty Manor has not dedicated the streets over to the City and until Mr. Hood turns them over by a deed of dedication, the City cannot take care of them.

Mayor Manus asked Street Commissioner Ralph Land to get a hold of Mr. Hood and get this in the works so the City can help those residents.
