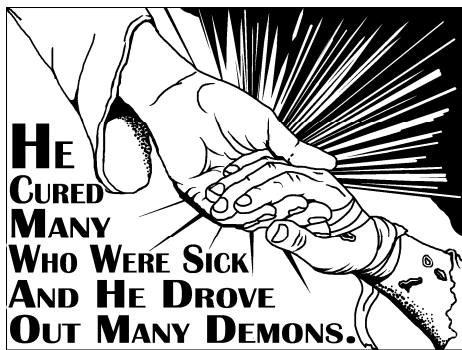

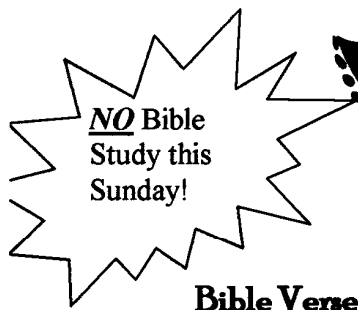
Servefest 2009 Thanks!

I was wondering what we believe about Angels. Do we all have one that is always with us?

What the Church believes about angels...I could fit all of that on the head of a pin. I know that might sound really strange or even condescending, but it's the truth! It was part of the opening question of St. Thomas Aquinas asked when he went into his discussion on explanation of angels. He said, "How many angels can dance on the head of a pin?" And the reality is, as many as you want, because they are not confined in bodies as we are and, therefore, time and space don't mean the same thing. He went on to say that they are pure, spiritual beings, much like our souls apart from our bodies, a soul being spirit. St. Thomas also said, "It seems that the soul does not differ from an angel except in it's union with the body." But that's not to say that we are going to become angels when we die and our souls leave our bodies, for he says, "The soul and an angel are not the same species."

Now the Scriptures speak of angels as messengers from God, as ones who do His work here on earth and bring His message. There's references to them throughout the Bible, some mentioned by name, like Raphael (found in the Book of Tobit), Gabriel (who appears in both the Book of Daniel and the Gospel of Luke) and Michael (showing up in the Book of Daniel, the Letter of Jude, and the Book of Revelation) and others that go unnamed, like the three angels that appear to Abraham (the Book of Genesis, chapter 18) or the one who turns up in the furnace with the three young men (the Book of Daniel, chapter 3). But in whatever way they appear, they're always at the service of God. Now as far as angels that watch over us, those angels that we call "guardian angels," it tells us throughout the Scriptures (the Book of Tobit 12:12, the Book of Zechariah 1:12, the Book of Job 33:23-24, Psalms 34: 7, 91:10-13, the Gospel of Luke 16:22, the Gospel of Matthew 18:10) that there are angels that surround us and protect us sent from God. In the *Catechism of the Catholic Church*, paragraph 336, it describes guardian angels this way:

"From its beginning until death, human life is surrounded by their watchful care and intercession. 'Beside each believer stands an angel as protector and shepherd leading him to life.' Already here on earth the Christian life shares by faith in the blessed company of angels and men united in God."

Now I could go on for days about angels, but these are the main points to remember. Namely, there are angels, we're not going to become one and they're watching over us.
