On Friday, October 29, the faculty of St. Mary's School attended INPEC 2010. The theme of this 2-day conference was "Unity and Diversity: A Design for Success." The teachers had the opportunity to chose from many small group sessions covering a wide variety of topics related to teaching children in the 21st century. Here are a few of the sessions attended by St. Mary's teachers: Multisensory Phonemic Awareness and Phonics, Differentiated Learning, Strategies to Reduce Relational Aggression in your School, and the keynote address, Drumming to the Beat of Different Marchers. The teachers all felt that they learned many practical ideas to implement in the classroom, as well as being inspired and motivated to continue to improve instruction, and to meet the needs of all the students in our school.

As an added bonus, two of our faculty members also won valuable prizes for our school! A group of vendors exhibiting at the conference sponsored a scavenger hunt of the exhibits. Names were drawn from the completed scavenger hunt papers turned in on Friday. Mrs. Kathy Denny won a one-year subscription to Mathscape.com, which is an online math practice website developed by graduates of MIT. This subscription is valued at \$10 per student, which would translate to almost \$2000! Mrs. Trish Witkemper won a team building activity from Unique Leadership Experience. The activity can be either a Zipline Adventure in North Webster, IN for 10 faculty members or an inservice provided at our school for 25 staff members. This prize is valued at \$950. These prizes, along with the many ideas and techniques learned on Friday, made the day a valuable experience!

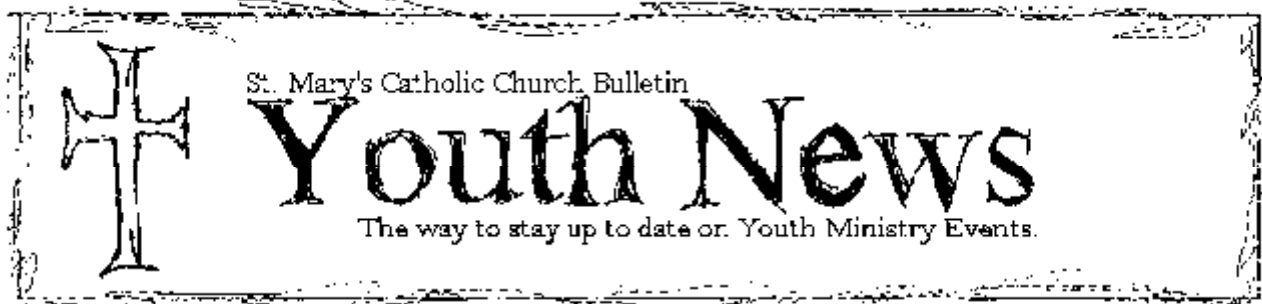
