**Update on Parish Facilities**

St. Mary’s parish, with the approval of the Archdiocese, has signed a contract to purchase 44 acres of land on the east side of Millhousen Road at the south edge of Greensburg. We will close on the purchase in January if the site, after careful examination, proves satisfactory as to access, approval of rezoning, extension of water and sewer, topography, and soil conditions. The site looks very promising, but we are not locked in to buying the land if these conditions are not met.
